Approximately 91% of teachers each year **reach into their own pockets to pay for school supplies**, or they ask students and parents to buy them.²

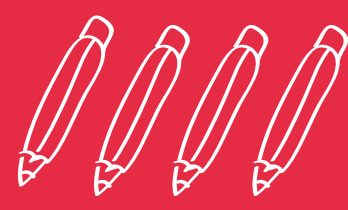
The **average teacher spends \$500** of his or her own money annually on supplies for projects, arts & crafts and cleaning the classroom.²
